#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greetings from your Grace Lutheran church council! We kicked off 2023 with the addition of our new pastors, Pastor Kevin and Pastor Carla. It is a blessing to have a family team who have already made a huge difference in our worship and education. They have been a good fit with our church family and our community. We are pleased to see that people are returning to Grace Lutheran Church and many new families are joining!

Many improvements to the church were completed this year. Here are the highlights:

- We insulated the back downstairs entry to the preschool and storage room. This was completed for \$2,000 and has eliminated our problems with freezing pipes.
- Thanks to David Lyons, we now have diagrams throughout the church facility locating things such as electrical panels and water shut off valves.
- The sanctuary leak has been repaired so there will be no more buckets up front! This was completed for \$200 by Lowe's.
- Our front outside railing has been repaired by Dan Boy. He did a beautiful job and at a minimal fee.
- Gary Meyer did a great job remodeling our new robe area behind the cry room. It has given us much needed space.
- The sculpture engraving has been completed outside the Parrish office. Thanks to Brandon Caneva.
- Additional cameras have been placed outside to protect our facility and members.

As part of our congregational support, three of our high school graduates were each awarded a \$500 scholarship. We also continue to support Lutherans Outdoors and Outlaw Ranch. The Red Bucket has generated money to send children to camp. We believe this is a cornerstone to bringing our young people closer to God and helping to form their faith. Consecration Sunday generated giving to support our church and its ministry. Thanks to San Monahan, Pastor Kevin, and the consecration committee for their guidance. We are also gratified that Believers Fellowship Church rented our preschool rooms to conduct their morning preschool classes after losing their church to fire. We miss the busy voices of the children now that they are back in their own facility.

2023 brought another successful Sturgis Motorcycle Rally and GLCW was back to serve breakfast. Thanks to all the church members who helped and to Debbie Patmore for heading up the effort. The Christian Motorcyclist Association was here and gave a donation for use of the church. Back in April, we had a successful Easter Egg Drive. Thanks to Brandon Caneva and our Easter bunny, Tim Potts.

The worship and education committees have grown their programs and it's good to see so many children, youth, and adults involved. Heather Kreutz and Diana Bauer will be filling two of three open council positions. Please consider serving with us. Additionally, our 2024 budget has been approved by the congregation. Grace's pastors and staff are the best around and the council approved raises for all. Their hard work benefits the church family.

It has been an honor to serve as your president. God bless you all and let's continue to work and grow in our faith and love for one another.

#### Report to the Congregation - 2023

#### Pastor Carla Nelson, Youth & Family Pastor

Wow! We've served together for a year! What a blessing to have so many faithful and gifted members and friends at Grace Lutheran Church. Wow! Wow! What awesome youth and young adults we have at Grace Lutheran Church.

My main responsibility is to support all aspects of the Education Ministry at Grace Lutheran Church.

This fall, I began a Wednesday evening Bible Study at 5 pm studying the minor prophets. This Bible Study meets whenever we have Wednesday Night Live (during the school year). A group of young women have also begun meeting monthly for Bible Study and we are studying women of the Bible. The group chooses a day that works best so it changes each month. Please ask Pastor Carla if you are interested in joining either Bible Study.

I preach at least once a month at Grace. I assist Pastor Kevin in a variety of ways. We often attend different events so we can be represented in a variety of places. We enjoyed getting to know the regulars and grew closer to the Grace volunteers. We got to know the members of the Chrisian Motorcyclist Association who utilizes the Rose Room and provide worship each day at Grace. We also monitored the city photo stand the Thursday of the Rally and that provided some good exposure for Grace Lutheran as well as serving as a fundraiser.

I visit with our wonderful quilters group and try to attend most WELCA meetings and programs.

I organized a table for Grace Lutheran at the Lighting of the Christmas Tree. We gave candy canes with invites to Christmas worship.

I also have had several meetings to stir up interest in the ELCA National Youth Gathering next year in New Orleans and also Caraway Street. Our youth can't commit to the Youth Gathering, so we will offer a shorter opportunity during the summer for our high school students. We continue to explore interest in Caraway Street. I have preached a couple times at St. Thomas Episcopal, Sturgis as well as visited several churches in connection with the campus ministry and mission start.

# 2023 Annual Report to Congregations

### All With Your Partnership in Healing Outreach

Runaway & Homeless Youth have brighter futures. 93% returned to their family or transitioned to a safe living environment and 100% enrolled in school or a GED program at discharge.

Children & teens are healing from trauma. 89% of youth in Foster Care and 91% of youth in Residential Treatment showed reduced trauma symptoms over the course of their time with LSS.

Mentors are making a difference. 97% of high school mentees are on track to graduate with their class in May and 92% indicate they have improved self-esteem.

#### Families are safer.

65% of individuals in family violence intervention demonstrate a reduction in criminal thinking. This is a staggering increase of 29% from when the program was transitioned to LSS.

### LSS Strategic Plan In Action

This year marked the first year of our new strategic plan in action. Our board of directors, executive team and leadership developed a four-year strategic plan and line of sight that guides our work toward making the greatest contribution to accomplishing our vision that all people in South Dakota will be healthy, safe and accepted.

We continue to identify areas for positive impact through listening to unmet community needs, collaboration and strategic priorities that are family-centered and ensure equitable access for those we serve.

Our operational strategies prioritize workforce & inclusivity within our organization and communities, financial viability of the agency and our services, and sharing the positive impact our work makes in the community through storytelling.

#### This Year At A Glance

Expanded Mentoring Services to serve youth in more communities throughout the state

Strengthened efforts to prioritize family role in an individual's success by elevating youth & family voice

Implemented Strengthening Families, a curriculum that helps build strong communication between parents and their children and helps families navigate conflict

Resettled 197 refugees through traditional resettlement and 290 Ukrainian refugees through Uniting for Ukraine pathways. We are expecting an additional 400 traditional and 50 U4U.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Grace and peace to you from God, our Father, and from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen!

Greeting from your sisters and brothers in Christ at St Dysmas Lutheran Church!

There is an old saying that the only constant is change; and 2023 lived up to that statement. Working inside the walls, especially in 2023, has seen some significant changes to policies, visitation requirements, and schedules. What we see as stumbling blocks, God uses to his glory. Even amidst the many challenges, God has been at work in amazing ways in the lives of people inside and outside the walls.

Firstly, thank you for your support to insure that the ministry of St Dysmas stays vibrant and active. We do not exist without the support and engagement from you. St Dysmas is YOUR ministry to those experiencing incarceration; and we are grateful for your partnership.

Here are a few highlights for this year:

- On any given day, there are approximately 3750 people incarcerated in the South Dakota Department of Corrections system. In 2023, we worked with and saw attendance of approximately 574 individuals to worship, Bible studies, and one-on-one pastoral care visits. Worship and Bible study attendance has steadily increased over the year at each site.
- We had 31 baptisms of adult men including 3 affirmations of baptism.
- We were able to hold special worship on Easter and Christmas Eve inside the facilities.
- Our Reformation Festivals took place at both Sioux Falls and Springfield on Reformation Weekend in October. A special meal was served at Springfield, and inmates were allowed to share the meal with their family that could attend.
- The annual special meal was held in Sioux Falls in August sponsored by Peace Lutheran Church in Sioux Falls.
- Worship switched to Tuesday evenings from 5:00 to 8:00 at Springfield. We have seen great participation by visitors to Springfield since this change occurred.
- Worship in Sioux Falls changed to Wednesday afternoons from 1:30 to 3:30. While this is not ideal, we have still had visitors attend very regularly.
- We have seen increasing engagement and attendance with our reentry work on the inside. Mitch Wilson worked with 244 individuals preparing to be released from incarceration.
- Accompanied 156 individuals once they were released to help them transition back into life on the outside.
- Mitch also worked in the Minnehaha County jail with 541 individuals housed there.
- Worked with the Department of Corrections and St Francis House to accompany 36 treatment women into work release.
- Over 3700 Christmas Treat Sacks were distributed the week before Christmas. Every person in the South Dakota Prison System received a sack, also people in the Minnehaha County and Yankton County jails.
- The Sioux Falls congregation again took up the challenge to support a ministry outside of themselves. All inmate offering goes to this fund, and for 2023, they will give Church on the Street a check for \$2271.
- The Springfield congregation took up the same challenge. They will distribute their funds after the January Inside Council Meeting. They will have approximately \$750 to distribute.
- I was able to visit 46 congregations to tell the story of St Dysmas and worship together.

These are just a few of the ways God has been at work through St Dysmas. I give thanks to God for the many gifts that the has entrusted to us. Through the faithful partnership of many of you, we continue to be able to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ to this who need to hear it most; "setting the captives free..."

Church on the Street continues to show up with the good news of Jesus, especially where folks are experiencing homelessness and poverty. You'll find us on the streets, visiting folks in shelters, cars, hospitals, laundry mats, and jails. This year, our offices moved to 515 N. Main. Ave inside the Multi-Cultural Center and are accessible through the Minnehaha County building, so more people are stopping by since they're already in the building for other things. Skylar Allen, Director of Organization, oversees record growth in food requests, with 242 families accessing the pantry during the year's first quarter and 885 families in the fourth quarter.

Also, this year, we and several of our partners worked with Sioux Falls Thrive to get the Eat Well Sioux Falls Mobile Market into food deserts in our town. Luke Senst is the Market Manager in addition to being our Director of Media Ministries. The mobile market is one example of how partnerships and collaborations are how we help share God's love in tangible ways.

Finally, it is a blessing to be Church together, sharing the best and worst of life and leaning on the promises of our Savior. Harriet Monson, Director of Laundry with Love, said it best: "One of the best moments for me this year was when the young single mom who moved into a place with a washer and dryer (so she doesn't need our services anymore) but she came back to visit."

Thank you for all the ways you are part of Church on the Street through your prayers, financial donations, in-kind donations, visits, and sharing our story. You are a blessing!

Thank you, to all of the individuals and congregations that supported the ministry of Lutherans Outdoors(LO) with financial gifts. Also, thank you to all of the individuals who attended summer camps, retreats, and travel experiences. LO cannot be the ministry that welcomes all to explore and experience Christ's love in community and creation without you!

#### REIMAGINING LUTHERANS OUTDOORS

The Board of Lutherans Outdoors emphasis in 2023 was the **REIMAGINING of** Lutherans Outdoors. Eight Task Forces have met, and continue to meet, diving into eight audits of the ministry. These eight areas are Philosophy, Finance, Financial Development, Marketing, Governance, Facility, Program, and Staffing. Results so far include the development of new Core Values where we promise to **EXPLORE FAITH**, **WELCOME ALL. BUILD LEADERS**, and **CARE FOR ALL CREATION**.

There are nearly 100 recommendations that have resulted from these eight audits. The recommendations will provide guidance for the Strategic process LO will develop for the next several years. The final results of the **REIMAGINING** will be presented to the Board of Directors at their January meeting, with a presentation to the voting members at the LO 2023 Annual Meeting in June 2024.

#### STAFF UPDATES

During 2023, Lutherans Outdoors said goodbye to Teri Gayer, who served many roles with LO during the past 30-plus years, most recently as the Director of Klein Ranch. During the celebration of 50 years of ministry at Klein Ranch last July, Teri was recognized for her ministry.

In May, LO said hello to Skylar Schwab, who assumed the Program Director position at Outlaw Ranch. Klaire Hudson resigned earlier in the spring from this position after serving in this role. Skylar jumped right into a busy summer and we are very excited she has joined the LO family!

#### **SUMMER 2023 | SUMMER 2024**

Our summer camper attendance increased by 15% as a whole in 2023. Outlaw Ranch saw a 22% increase boosted by nearly 100 more Family Campers. Klein Ranch saw a 19% increase. NeSoDak saw a 4% decrease in campers. The total camper number was nearly 1,350.

Our Adult Travel Experiences had over 60 participants to our two destinations: Holden Village and Branson. In 2024, Experiences will be to Minneapolis for a theatre event in April, to the Upper Peninsula of Michigan in September, to the Smokie Mountains and Dollywood in October, and a return to Branson in November.

The new Horse Corral at Outlaw Ranch was completed in 2023. This great addition provides a wonderful place to care for the horses and a safe place for campers to begin their horse care education and rides each week.
