



Lenten Series - Making Sense of the Cross

As Christians, the cross is so important to us that it deserves not just our attention but our questions—What does the cross mean? What does it accomplish? Why did Jesus have to die? These are the questions we will be pondering this Lent beginning on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 18, as we use the video and book by Dr. David Lose of Luther Seminary, in his series *Making Sense of the Cross*.

In the series we will be look at the four distinct portraits of Jesus found in the gospels and get a glimpse into each author's perspective on the life, death and resurrection of Jesus. Dr. Lose will help us analyze the three popular theories of atonement, which literally means *at-one-ment*. In other words, making something that was once broken whole again. Here is a brief overview of **The Three Models of Atonement**:

The first theory, **Ransom and Victory**, was popular for much of the first thousand years after Jesus. This theory draws heavily on the fall of Adam and Eve and original sin. The fall of Adam and Eve resulted in a broken relationship and put humanity under Satan's rule. But God sought a way to save us in the person of Jesus, who triumphed over sin, death and the devil through the cross and resurrection.

The second theory, **Substitution, Satisfaction and Sacrifice** has been popular for the last thousand years. This theory sees humanity as owing God because our sin was an offense against God's honor and justice. Once again, God loves humanity so God sends Jesus to pay our debt and through his substitution and sacrifice on the cross we are redeemed.

The third theory, **Example and Encouragement**, rejects the need for a blood sacrifice in order to forgive sin and emphasizes the cross as a powerful example of God's great love for us, an example that teaches us and inspires us to love God and to love others.

In this Lenten series from Dr. Lose, we will do more than see the cross intellectually. We will see how the cross allows us to truly experience God's profound love. This is "doing atonement." Rather than an idea we can comprehend, we are drawn into a living relationship with God through experiencing God's grace, given to lead us through death into new life in Christ.

Our Lenten journey will also give us the chance to consider how the cross shapes our lives. It will allow us space to ask tough questions. And it will allow us to grow deeper in our commitment in following Christ into the transforming love of God.

A LENTEN PROJECT for GRACE LUTHERAN

The disciplines or practices of the season of Lent are: prayer, fasting, and giving. So, Lent is a wonderful time to have special opportunity to give. The Grace WELCA invites the whole Grace Lutheran Church Family to donate items for **PERSONAL CARE KITS** for Lutheran World Relief. Each week of Lent, you are invited to bring one of the items needed for the kits. WELCA will assemble the kits and send them off to LWR. The kits go all over the world to hospitals, villages, towns, boarding schools, wherever needed.

You can bring your item on the Wednesday named or the following Sunday. There will be boxes to collect the items both in the narthex (Sanctuary) and in the Sonshine room (Fellowship Hall downstairs).

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 18, 2025. On Ash Wednesday (or the following Sunday), everyone is invited to bring a light-weight bath size towel (between 20" x 40" and 27" x 52", dark color recommended. It needs to be light weight so it can be easily hand washed and dries quickly.) All items need to be new. Also, there must not be any religious symbols, patriotic symbols, camouflage or words.

- **February 18** – **One** light-weight **BATH TOWEL** (20" x 40" (minimum size) - 27" x 52" (maximum size) – new – dark colors better
- **February 25** – **Two** bath-size **BARS of SOAP** equaling a total 8-9 ounces, any brand, original wrapping
- **March 4** – **One** Adult Size **TOOTHBRUSH** in original packaging (multi-packs may be donated and WELCA will split and package)
- **March 11** – **One** sturdy **COMB**, medium to wide-tooth
- **March 18** – **No Wednesday Night Live or Lenten Service (Spring Break)**
- **March 25** – **One** metal **NAIL CLIPPER**

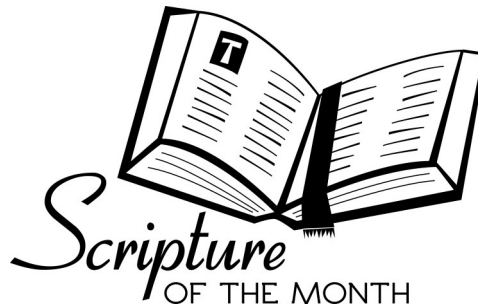

Grace Lutheran Church Red Bucket campaign raises funds for Scooper Sam and Stagebarn Stallion Closets

STURGIS — Giving back to the community is a core mission for members of Grace Lutheran Church, and this quarter's outreach ministry focused on supporting the Scooper Sam Closet through the church's ongoing Red Bucket campaign.

Funds collected during Sunday and Wednesday worship services were designated to support Scooper Sam Closet locations serving students in Sturgis and Piedmont. The closets provide essential items such as food, clothing, school supplies, hygiene products and other necessities to students and families in need.

Pastor Kevin Jensen said the generosity of church members made the effort especially meaningful. "What a blessing it has been to see our members respond so favorably to the Red Bucket offering to help students in need at our local schools," Jensen said. "Each quarter, our church council selects a mission to support, and this time we branched out into a new one. We pray this will bless students who come to school needing a little extra help to get by."

Pastor Carla Nelson highlighted the role children and youth play in the campaign. "The children and youth of Grace carry the Red Bucket through the sanctuary during Sunday morning and Wednesday evening worship," Nelson said. "It was especially meaningful for them to know that the money they collected this quarter would help kids at their own schools."

The donation will support students at every level. At Sturgis Williams Middle School, ISS Coordinator Alicia Harris said the \$675 donation will help meet a wide range of student needs.

"It's so important for our kids," Harris said. "We support students who may need school supplies, shoes, clothing, or even food to take home. This program allows us to give back directly to the community."

Harris, who is in her first year coordinating the Scooper Sam Closet, said donated clothing from the school's lost-and-found is collected every two weeks and recirculated through the closet after being cleaned. "We're working toward getting a washer and dryer so donated clothes can be washed and reused," Harris said. "That's our next big goal." Donations toward the washer and dryer can be made payable to Sturgis Williams Middle School, 1425 Cedar Street, with a note specifying the Scooper Sam Closet.

At Sturgis Brown High School, Student Council members Leigha Long and Murielle Hagen oversee the Scooper Sam Closet, which is stocked with food, clothing and personal items for students.

"We get a lot of donations, especially food items that won't go bad, like mac and cheese," Long said. "We also have clothes, coats, hoodies, prom dresses, socks, hygiene items and feminine products, anything students might need."

Long said the closet was originally started by students Tori Williams and Maddie Richter and is intentionally passed down to younger students to ensure continuity. "We keep it very private," Long said. "It's a place where students can come in without anyone knowing. They sign out what they take so we know what to restock, and it really helps students feel supported."

At Stagebarn Middle School, counselor Maria Hartung coordinates the Stallion Closet, which serves students facing financial challenges.

"The Stallion Closet provides items students may be lacking at home, snacks, food, school supplies, shoes, clothes and hygiene products," Hartung said. "Any student can come in and get what they need."

Hartung said the donation will help the school move closer to sending food packages home with students on weekends and during long breaks.

"When you see students wearing new clothes or using items they really needed and feeling comfortable at school, it makes it all worth it," Hartung said.

Community impact: The Red Bucket campaign raised \$1,500, which was supplemented by a \$500 matching grant from the South Dakota ELCA Synod. The combined \$2,000 was divided evenly among Scooper Sam Closet locations at Sturgis Williams Middle School, Sturgis Brown High School and Stagebarn Middle School. Church leaders said the donation reflects Grace Lutheran Church's ongoing commitment to supporting local students and strengthening the community through outreach and service.
