

Crossing the Lake for Healing

They came to the other side of the sea, to the country of the Gerasenes. And when he had stepped out of the boat, immediately a man out of the tombs with an unclean spirit met him. Mark 5:1-2

Jesus had just crossed the lake with his disciples when they stepped onto the shore of the Gerasene's and came face-to-face with the man everyone in the region feared. He lived naked among the tombs,

howling through the night. People had tried to chain him, but he broke free again and again. He was, by every standard of the day, hopeless.

The Bible says he had a legion of demons, but today we might say he was schizophrenic, perhaps addicted, perhaps bipolar, perhaps many other things as well. What is most striking is that Jesus even went see to him at all. This was Gentile territory, a graveyard—unclean, off-limits for a Jewish rabbi. The kind of place to avoid. But Jesus doesn't avoid people the world has written off. He crosses boundaries to get to them.

That's what it takes to do addiction ministry. It means going where others won't—because it's hard, because it's messy, and because addicts rarely bring much money or prestige to a church. How can Grace Lutheran chose that path—to run toward hurting people while others run away? And pondering that leads us into the second part of the story.

Jesus commands the demons to leave the man and go into a herd of pigs that run off a cliff and drown in the sea. When the townspeople heard what happened, they came running. They found the man clothed, calm, and in his right mind. You'd expect them to celebrate, to be amazed and impressed. But instead, the text says, "They were afraid." And then they asked Jesus to leave. **They ask Jesus to leave! Why?**

Because they saw what it cost them. All those pigs—gone. In their eyes, one man's restoration wasn't worth it. It was too unsettling, too expensive, too dangerous. What would be next? Our society still does this.

Addiction is a health issue, yet we keep spending far more to punish than to heal. How do we deal with addiction? Three out of four people suffering from addiction do not have access to treatment or the medications that could bring healing. In 2024, the U.S. spent \$44.5 billion on drug enforcement and incarceration—less than half that on treatment and recovery. We imprison more people than any other developed nation, most for drug-related offenses, and disproportionately people of color.

Instead of investing in healing, we chain people up and put them away. It's the same thing the Gerasenes did! How can we look at the cost of compassion and decide it's not worth it? How can we tell Jesus to leave?

Every time a congregation chooses to run toward the hurting instead of away, it is walking in the footsteps of Jesus. The Gerasene man's story is a reminder that real healing will cost us something. But the alternative—sending Jesus away—is far more costly.

After you ponder this **let me know what your ideas are for Grace to become more involved in addiction ministry.** Maybe such action could lead us to some healing waters and a special time of Thanksgiving!

GUIDELINES FOR USHERS

GREETING:

- Arrive at least 20 minutes prior to the service.
- Turn the lights on. The panel of switches should have the top row and the two switches on the right of the second row turned on. These are the chancel and nave light switches. The two to the left on the second row are for dimming/brightening the main lights. Hold these switches up to make sure the lights are bright for the Sunday service. If a video is presented, dim the lights until the end of the video, and then turn them back up.
- 2 Ushers welcome the worshipers at the front doors while the other 2 ushers greet worshipers with a bulletin inside. Please keep the front doors shut.
- Standing at each side of the aisle, please offer children's busy bags to all young children. Stand near the pews to prevent congestion at the back of the church. You may usher people to their seats. Never seat anyone during a prayer, but wait until the prayer is finished.

WORSHIP SERVICE:

- After the service begins, one of the ushers must count the worshipers (including all the children and the worship leaders). Do this from the balcony. Record the number on the clipboard in the drawer in the table at the back of the church.
- Offering plates are in the ushers' cabinet. Have the plates uncovered and ready. Come forward as soon
 as it is time for the offering. Offering should be received starting from the front and proceeding to the back.
 Two ushers should be on the outside aisles and two ushers in the center aisle. After the offering, two
 ushers shall bring the plates to the front and give them to the acolytes.
- Be alert for any emergency.

COMMUNION/AFTER SERVICE:

- During communion, ushers should put down the kneelers in the front pews and begin ushering
 communicants to the altar rail first and then to the front pew. Two ushers should stay in the center aisle
 on each side by the front pew to usher people to the rails and two should usher communicants from each
 pew. Time them getting to the front so they don't have to wait long in the aisle. (When communion is
 continuous, only two are needed to usher communicants from their pew.)
- After the service, pick up any papers/trash left in the pews and put hymnals in their proper place and place all bibles between the hymnals and in front of the Other Song Book.

Answering the call

Yehiel Curry is installed as ELCA presiding bishop

When Yehiel Curry was installed as presiding bishop of the ELCA on Saturday, Elizabeth Eaton, the former presiding bishop, led the assembly in welcoming Curry. "Yehiel, bishop in the church of God, we have looked forward to your coming with great joy," she exclaimed to a diverse, colorfully dressed and enthusiastic assembly at Central Lutheran Church in Minneapolis.

"With all my heart," Curry began before pausing emotionally. After Eaton went to his side and placed a hand on his arm, he continued. "I thank you for your welcome. I hope to serve among you in Christ's name. And in the joy of the Spirit, may the peace of God be upon this house and this assembly."

Throughout the service, a variety of hymns and songs were led by the National Lutheran Choir and musicians from the ELCA Metropolitan Chicago Synod and St. Olaf College, Northfield, Minn. Members of the ELCA Conference of Bishops, members of the Church Council and ecumenical, interreligious and global guests participated in the processional.

CeCee Mills, secretary-elect of the ELCA, began the installation with an African tradition, the pouring of libations in honor of "the God that created us and in recognition that we are because of the ancestors who preceded us and in the hope of those who will come," she said. "This ritual recognizes and shows respect for those who have come before and who have paved the way, and those who are yet to come."

Eaton, who presided at the service, then led an acknowledgement that the assembly was gathered on the ancestral homelands of the Dakota people.

Curry was introduced to the assembly by representatives of the Metropolitan Chicago Synod, where he served as bishop prior to being elected to a six-year term as presiding bishop. "Grounded in mission, he gave us the charge to 'Go, therefore,' and invited us to smile, embracing the joy of God's calling and trusting that our labor in the Lord is not in vain," said one synod representative.

Kevin Vandiver, pastor of Lutheran Church of the Reformation in Washington, D.C., delivered the sermon, emphasizing that God calls everyone to serve in different and sometimes unlikely ways. "Whether we are clergy or lay, all of us have wrestled with this concept of call," he said. "The truth is that everybody gets a call. Even Jesus is not exempt."

For Curry, that call to ministry took shape as he became first mission developer and then pastor of Shekinah Chapel in Riverdale, III., and it continues now. "There came a call over the portals of heaven into the earth, round about the South Side of Chicago, at 61st and Woodlawn," Vandiver said.

"Who would've thought that that young boy growing up on the South Side of Chicago would grow also in wisdom and stature and somebody would put their hand on him and say, 'We want you to be a lay mission developer'?" Vandiver continued. "Who would've thought in that moment that we'd be sitting here today? Look what the Lord has done!"

"It is our call too"

Sue Rothmeyer, current secretary of the ELCA, presented Curry for installation. Leaders from various church bodies lay hands on him, a sign of the church's unity, embodying its prayer for the Holy Spirit to guide and sustain him.

"The office of presiding bishop is now committed to you in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit," Eaton said to Curry. After a blessing and prayers, she removed from around her neck the pectoral cross, the common symbol of the office of bishop in the ELCA, and presented it to Curry, placing it around his neck.

Curry stood as Eaton presented him to the assembly for a standing ovation. Curry, Eaton and others then offered communion to the assembly.

Following the service, a public reception was held for those hoping to greet Curry. At an evening banquet, Curry introduced his family.

"I'm going to do something that is probably a little different," Curry said. "I am going to cede most of my time so that you can meet my wife and children." His wife, LaShonda Hicks-Curry, and their daughters, Shekinah, Ashirah and Shemiah (the last of them a recent graduate of the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago), each offered remarks.

Curry also lifted up his mother and recognized his siblings. "I stand on her shoulders, and nine of my 10 siblings are here, so I'm going to ask the rest of my family to stand."

He then invited various groups from across the church to stand in recognition. "May we leave this place and understand that we're more connected than we realize," Curry said.

For those present, the moment may have brought to mind Vandiver's earlier message: "It is not just the call of Bishop Curry—it is our call too."

In an uncertain age, when the church is on the precipice of change, Vandiver said, those across the ELCA must stand alongside Curry and "remember that we have something to say, we have something to offer."

"It is a call that you may have to say yes to every day, even when it seems like all heck is breaking loose. But—ring, ring—there is a call coming from the portals of heaven. It's for you."


Old Business:


- Confirmation is Oct. 26. The confirmation students will help with the volunteer duties including helping with the children's sermon.
