Faith That Makes Ripples

For this month's article I have asked a disciple of Grace, Bill Rossow, who is an active member and local Cub Scout leader, to help write this.

Pastor Kevin writes: If you have ever tossed a rock into a still pond, you know what happens. The splash is brief, but the ripples keep spreading—wide circles moving outward long after the rock itself disappears beneath the surface. Faith often works the same way.

In the Lutheran tradition, we confess that faith is God's gift—created and sustained by the Word and the Sacraments. Yet once faith is given, it does not remain hidden or motionless. Trust in Christ, planted in human hearts, inevitably sends ripples into the world around us.

The rock in the pond is Christ himself—crucified and risen—cast into the deep waters of a broken world. Sometimes we only notice the splash—the moment of baptism, the bread broken and the words “for you” spoken at the table. But God sees the widening circles: children shaped by patient love, communities healed by quiet courage, lives directed by grace received long ago.

Bill Rossow writes: As I prayed on what to write, what came to mind was my time with our puppet ministry. We spent hours each week preparing and I often wondered if we made a difference. Finally, I saw the answer one Confirmation Sunday, when those kids we saw so many Sundays taking in our Caraway Street puppets and reciting Bible verses, chose those very verses as their favorites to share at their Confirmation.

So, I was able to witness my little splash turn into a bigger splash as those kids knew those verses and recited them, with confidence, as they took another step toward an adulthood faith.

Pastor Kevin concludes: So take heart. Your faith, rooted in Christ, matters more than you know. God is still stirring the waters. And the ripples—by God's grace—are still spreading. The beauty of ripples is that they do not need our constant effort. Once the stone is tossed, the water does the work. So it is with faith. We are not called to manufacture results or control outcomes. We are called to trust the promise: that God is at work through us, even when we cannot see how far the ripples go.

Acts 1:8 shows God's Word rippling out in the early church: *But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.*



A LENTEN PROJECT for GRACE LUTHERAN

The disciplines or practices of the season of Lent are: prayer, fasting, and giving. So, Lent is a wonderful time to have special opportunity to give. The Grace WELCA invites the whole Grace Lutheran Church Family to donate items for **PERSONAL CARE KITS** for Lutheran World Relief. Each week of Lent, you are invited to bring one of the items needed for the kits. WELCA will assemble the kits and send them off to LWR. The kits go all over the world to hospitals, villages, towns, boarding schools, wherever needed.

You can bring your item on the Wednesday named or the following Sunday. There will be boxes to collect the items both in the narthex (Sanctuary) and in the Sonshine room (Fellowship Hall downstairs).

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 18, 2026. On Ash Wednesday (or the following Sunday), everyone is invited to bring a light-weight bath size towel (between 20" x 40" and 27" x 52", dark color recommended. It needs to be light weight so it can be easily hand washed and dries quickly.) All items need to be new. Also, there must not be any religious symbols, patriotic symbols, camouflage or words.

- **February 18** – **One** light-weight **BATH TOWEL** (20" x 40" (minimum size) - 27" x 52" (maximum size) – new – dark colors better
- **February 25** – **Two** bath-size **BARS of SOAP** equaling a total 8-9 ounces, any brand, original wrapping
- **March 4** – **One** Adult Size **TOOTHBRUSH** in original packaging (multi-packs may be donated and WELCA will split and package)
- **March 11** – **One** sturdy **COMB**, medium to wide-tooth
- **March 18** – **No Wednesday Night Live or Lenten Service (Spring Break)**
- **March 25** – **One** metal **NAIL CLIPPER**






